### REPRESENTATIVE MATTERS

#### Business Acquisition-Related Litigation

*Meda AB v. 3M Company, et al.* (Federal Court, New York, New York)

Represented seller of pharmaceutical business in defending against lawsuit by purchaser seeking damages in excess of \$200 million based on claims of fraud, breach of acquisition agreement, and breach of implied covenants. Following bench trial, obtained judgment dismissing all of purchaser's claims.

*In re Cogent Shareholders Litigation / Merion Capital L.P., et al. v. 3M Cogent, Inc.* (Delaware Chancery Court)

Represented acquirer of publicly-traded company in shareholder litigation and statutory appraisal action relating to client's acquisition of biometrics company valued at more than \$900 million.
